Focus on Periodontics

It is well recognised that for the majority of patients, the maintenance of periodontal health can be managed by most GDPs (1998 Adult Dental Health Survey). However, periodontal disease is of **insidious onset** and its presence can easily go undetected, especially in less obvious cases such as smokers. The survey also revealed that 60% of Scottish adults had visible plaque on their teeth, with 47% having periodontal pocketing of 4mm or more. This emphasises the need for periodontal screening in general dental practice. Furthermore, litigation for untreated periodontal disease is on the increase and there is a recognised **medico-legal obligation** to diagnose and treat such cases or refer on to specialist care.



Marilou Ciantar is a **specialist periodontist** at Blackhills. She undertook her postgraduate training in periodontology at the Eastman Dental Institute in London, where she subsequently read for a PhD and was also a part-time lecturer in periodontology. Marilou gained specialist periodontist status with the General Dental Council in 2000. Thereafter she trained in oral surgery, gaining specialist oral surgery status in 2007. She is a member of the British Society of Periodontology, International Team for Implantology, European Association of Osseointegration, Association of Dental Implantology and British Dental Association. She has also recently had the great honour of being elected as a Fellow of the International College of Dentists.

Marilou accepts referrals for periodontal treatment, as well as for oral surgery and implant surgery. She is prepared to help establish treatment plans for periodontal patients, where the referring dentist is involved in the 'shared care' of their patients and remains the primary care provider.

Marilou has extensive expertise in all areas of periodontal treatment and can make a significant difference to the long term prognosis for many teeth. Where the maintenance of periodontal health is unlikely to be successful, her experience in determining this can mean the avoidance of unnecessary therapy. This in turn allows for the rapid progression to other restorative options before further bone loss following tooth extraction occurs.

To help introduce herself to dental colleagues, Marilou, is willing to arrange '**Lunch & Learn**' events with practices or groups of practices. During the hour, she will present an overview of current knowledge regarding the aetiology and management of periodontal disease. The emphasis will be on the therapy and shared responsibility between dentist, hygienist and specialist. These informal sessions are eligible for **verifiable CPD** points for dentists and DCPs (certificates provided).

6. Socket preservation following tooth extraction – maintaining the soft tissue support for bridge pontics, dentures and implants (hands-on)

To help with the planning and logistics of this ambitious programme, please discuss with your colleagues and staff which topics you would like to attend, and then contact Trudie to **register your interest**. Most of the programmes will be for 1 – 2 hours in the evenings, at Blackhills Clinic. There will be **no charge** for the majority of the sessions and numbers will be restricted by the size of our waiting room (early arrivals get the most comfy seats). Each session will count as **verifiable CPD** and attendees will receive a certificate of attendance. Light refreshments will be available on arrival.
